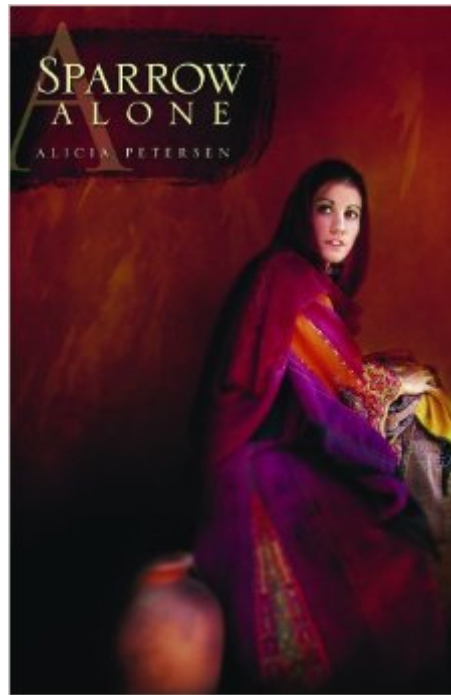


The book was found

This story has a great idea - a girl living in the time of Jesus, her brother ends up being the thief on the cross, she personally witnesses someone healed by Jesus, etc. I expected to love it, and looked forward to reading it. I personally hate reading bad writing, and this book made me cringe at certain points. The dialogue was unrealistic, and so were some of the situations. The characters were fine in and of themselves, but the author tried too hard to portray them, and it came out as forced, plus

they were generally flat and stereotypical. The dialogue literally sounded like something my 14 and 12 year old siblings would write...My sister, who is less picky about writing quality, also read the story, and even she could tell it wasn't great writing. She did finish it, but it was painful. In general I was disappointed by this story. It could have made a great story, but due to the poor writing quality, it wasn't. (For a creative take on the life of Jesus, *The Singer* by Calvin Miller is a different, but better, choice)
